Guide to Dressing

Your Grand Line and Association Officers as well as visitors strive to dress properly at the various Grotto activities they attend throughout the realm. With that thought in mind we offer this guide to use when sending out invitations and announcements of activities at your Grotto.

Formal

Tuxedo

When attending an event in which the participants are formally attired and formal attire has been requested, one may choose to wear a tuxedo or semi-formal attire.

It is generally accepted that a white dinner jacket be substituted for the black tuxedo jacket between Memorial Day and Labor Day.

Semi-Formal

Suit and Tie or Sport Jacket and Tie

Semi-formal attire may be substituted for formal attire if one is not a participant in the event.

Business Casual

Dress slack/Dockers and a button down shirt/pull over shirt

Business casual should be the most casual of dress for most Grotto events including stated meetings and business meetings.

Casual

Jeans or shorts and a pull over or tee shirt

This mode of attire should be reserved for the most casual of events such as a picnic, sporting event, or other outdoor activity.

Special Dress Codes

There may be functions that are themed events, such as Hillbilly Night, Motorcycle Night, or Hawaiian Luau, and on such occasion's one should dress accordingly.
